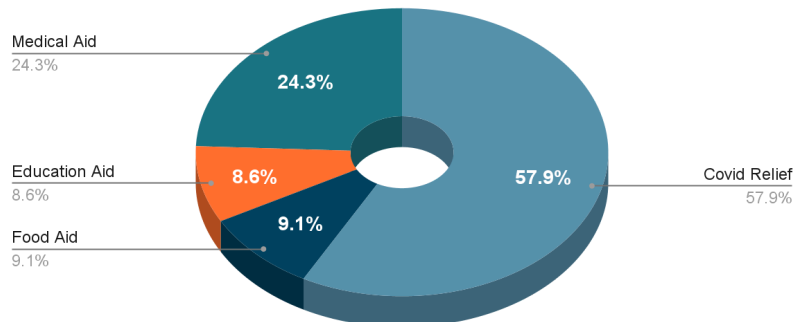

# COVID RELIEF

## 1. FOOD KIT DISTRIBUTION

During the COVID-19 lockdown, Al Ansaar Trust distributed 538 essential kits to residents in Alahalli who did not possess ration cards. This crucial operation was successfully carried out by a dedicated team of 70 volunteers, all while strictly adhering to COVID-19 health guidelines. Our commitment to assisting those in need remained unwavering even in the face of challenging circumstances.

## 2. WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

The COVID-19 crisis has profoundly impacted numerous lives, notably in the garment sector, where a significant female workforce faced factory closures, leading to despair. Alahalli, a community deeply affected, inspired the Al Ansaar Trust to step in and support struggling women who are the primary providers for their families. This video provides insight into the transformative effects of our initiative. Currently, approximately 25 women are benefiting from this program, crafting essential PPEs and medical gowns distributed to HBS Hospital, Mercy Mission, and various burial grounds and crematoriums, making a meaningful difference.

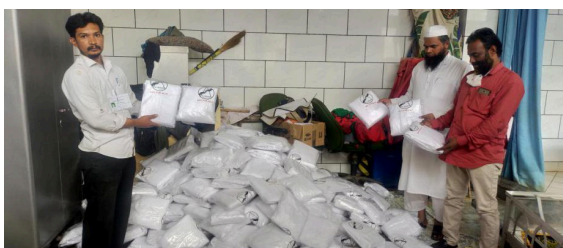

*9 Sep 2020:  
Al Ansaar trust handed over 300 PPE kits to BBMP in its fight against COVID 19. The programme was organised by BBMP Bommanahalli zone and all the nodal officers, doctors and other staff from Anjanapura ward, Konanakunte ward and gottigere ward were present.*

*On 5th October 2020, Al Ansaar Trust donated 100 PPEs to BBMP crematorium at Kudlu gate, Bommanahalli, Bengaluru. The donated PPEs will be used by poor relatives of the deceased who come to perform the last rites of the departed soul.*

*Till now we have donated more than 300 PPEs here.*







Al Ansaar Trust is a proud member of Mercy Mission, a collaborative alliance of NGOs committed to aiding migrant workers on their journeys back home via Sharmik Express trains. Daily, Mercy Mission prepares and distributes around 60,000 rotis throughout the train operations. Notably, a portion of these rotis is produced by Al Ansaar's women empowerment project. ### 3. LAST RITE SERVICES

At Al Ansaar, we extended our compassionate services by conducting last rites for the deceased during the COVID lockdown. This was especially vital during the initial wave when fear was widespread. Every day, we offered the solemn duty of transporting the departed to crematoriums and burial grounds, ensuring this essential service was provided entirely free of charge. In a time of great need, our commitment to supporting the community remained unwavering.





## MEDICAL AID

Thanks to your generous support, we've been providing invaluable services to those in need. This includes free doctor consultations, BP and blood sugar measurements, and a month's supply of essential medicines at no cost. We prioritize screening patients, primarily focusing on abandoned elderly individuals, destitute women, and chronically ill patients from underprivileged backgrounds who struggle to afford their necessary medications.

Here's a brief overview of our impact:

- Number of patients served per month: 100
- Monthly expenditure on medicines: ₹20,000
- Cost per patient per month: ₹200

Your support allows us to procure medicines directly from distributors at significantly reduced rates, greatly lowering the per-patient cost. This means our beneficiaries save approximately five times what they would have spent if they had to purchase the same medicines themselves. Your contribution is making a meaningful difference in the lives of those who need it most.



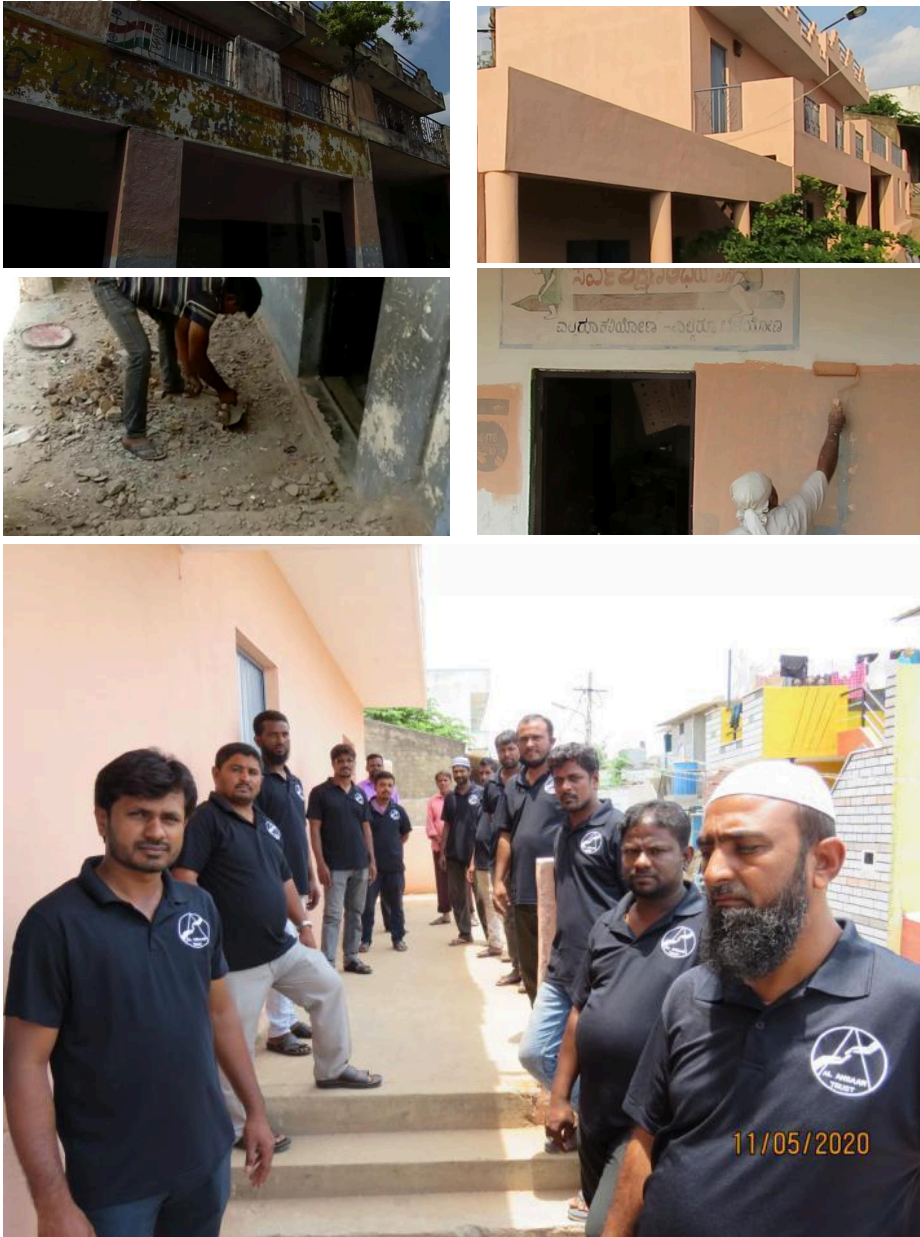




## EDUCATION

In May 2020, we embarked on a remarkable journey to revitalize the MG Nagar Govt Urdu Primary School. This crucial project was made possible through the collaborative efforts of local residents who found themselves unemployed as a result of the COVID-19 lockdown. The school was in a dire state of disrepair, but with the invaluable assistance of skilled locals, including masons, painters, electricians, and more, we undertook an extensive renovation.

This comprehensive transformation included floor repairs, roof waterproofing, painting, rewiring, installation of lights and fans, and the rejuvenation of blackboards. Together, we not only revived a crumbling school but also revitalized the spirit of the community, proving that unity and determination can overcome even the most challenging of circumstances.

And then in Oct of 2020 we renovated Alahalli Govt Kannada school. The condition of the school was deplorable, with deteriorating floors and an overgrown, weed-infested field where children had their midday meals sitting on the bare ground.

To enhance the learning environment and ensure the children's well-being, we took immediate action. We had pavers laid to create a clean, comfortable area for the students to enjoy their meals without dirt disturbing their food. Additionally, we invested in the installation of new flooring in all the classrooms, providing the students with a safe and inspiring space for their education.



## FOOD AID

We may not have an Orphanage / Old Age Home / Home for the destitute in Alahalli. But we do take care of the orphans, old and destitute women of Alahalli with the support of locals.

This is how we do it:

We find small houses whose rent is around ₹2000/month and house them there. Monthly ration of ₹1500 is also provided to them. Sick among them are also treated and given medicine for free through our monthly medical camps.

Their neighbours/our Al Ansaar volunteers keep a watch on them, help them in whatever way possible and call us in case of emergency.

This way our community in Alahalli is able to take care of our weak and orphans.

We have been doing this since 2 years. And presently taking care of more than a dozen elderly destitute women and equal number of orphans.
